1. Complete and return the application (**write legibly and complete fully**) **by July 15th, 2020**.
2. The application will be processed and, if approved, the number of permits requested will be sent to you.
3. Permits will be issued on a first come first serve basis and are limited to 10 hunters per season.
4. There will be a mandatory pre-hunt meeting as well as a post hunt survey. Schedule TBD
5. The Deer hunting season at the Luneack Preserve will take place from **November 1st through January 1st**.

The permit requires you to follow state hunting rules as governed by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, including purchase of a state hunting license and Luneack hunting rules. The preserve is considered **private property** and permits from HeadWaters Land Conservancy are required – if you encounter a person hunting that cannot produce their permit, you should report the trespass to the local DNR Conservation Officer (Hotline: 1-800-292-7800) or law enforcement agency as well as HeadWaters office in Gaylord at (989) 731-0573.
